NOTIFICATION

No. 410-WBCROS/B.B./2019- 30th May, 2019 & No. 186/1 & 2/WBCROS/2020- 24th June, 2020 – In exercise of the power conferred by sub-section (1) of section 41, read with clause (xi) and (xii) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya Act, 2001 (West Ben. Act XI of 2001), The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, with previous approval of the State Government, hereby makes the following amendments in the Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya (Admission and Examinations) Regulations, 2006 (hereinafter referred as the said regulations of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling) :-

Amendment

1) For regulation 3 substitute the following regulation:

3. Admission and registration in Madhyamik (Secondary) level course of Study-
3. (1) (c) Produce a pass certificate of class VIII standard from any recognized institution(s) (Govt. /Govt. Aided / Govt. sponsored / Govt. affiliated private /Non- Govt. Private but NOC given by Govt.) school is mandatory.

2) to sub-regulation (3) of regulation 3, add the following proviso:

3. Admission and registration in Madhyamik (Secondary) level course of Study-
- 3 (3) A student once registered with The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling at Madhyamik (Secondary) level is valid upto five years. He/She is not entitled to register for the same period in any other study centre of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or any other Govt. recognised Board / Council. If at any point of time during or after admission / registration / enrolment, a student found to have furnishing false information(s), his/her candidature and all the certificate(s), admit card(s) and mark sheet(s)

issued by The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling will be immediately cancelled and all fees paid by the said student(s) shall not be refunded. The student is liable for that false information(s). The Council has no liability for false information of the student. At the time of admission the all information(s) of the student will be taken / entitled as per certificate of eligibility of education qualification (minimum class VIII pass) from any Institution of Govt. recognised Board(s) / Council(s) / Open School(s).

3(4) A Transgender student can take admission/register/ enroll their names at Madhyamik (Secondary) level of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling. They will eligible to appear in Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) after one year from their Enrollment /Registration under The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling. They shall be entitled to complete the course of study within five years from their first Enrollment/Registration. Other rule(s) & regulation(s) is/are applicable for them is same which is stated in the regulation(s) of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling.

3(5) A student already passed Madhyamik (Secondary) level examination from any Board/Council/Open School, will not be allowed to register in The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling for Madhyamik (Secondary) level.

3) to sub-regulation (3) of regulation 4, add the following proviso:

4. Admission and registration in Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level course of Study-

4 (3) A student once registered with The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level, he /she is not entitled to register for the same period in any other study centre of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or any other Govt. recognised Board / Council. If at any point of time during or after admission / registration / enrolment, a student found to have furnishing false information(s), his/her candidature and all the certificate(s), admit card(s) and mark sheet(s) issued by The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling will be immediately cancelled and all fees paid by the said student(s) shall not be refunded. The student is liable for that false information(s). The Council has no liability for false information of the student. At the time of admission the all information(s) of the student will be taken / entitled as per certificate of eligibility of education qualification (minimum class X pass) from any Govt. recognised Board(s) / Council(s) / Open School(s).

4 (4) A Transgender student can take admission/register/ enroll their names at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling. They will be eligible to appear in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) after one year from their Enrollment /Registration under The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling. They shall be entitled to complete the course of study within five years from their first Enrollment/Registration. Other rule(s) & regulation(s) is/are applicable for them is same which is stated in the regulation(s) of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling.

4 (5) A student already passed Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level examination from any Govt. recognized Board/Council/Open School will not be allowed to admit in The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling for Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level.

4 (6) A student who will take admission in Mathematics, Science Subjects, Geography and Computer Application at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level of the West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling must be obtained 35% marks in that subjects at Madhyamik (Secondary) level.

Mathematics	35 % in Mathematics
Biology	35 % in Life Science
Physics or Chemistry or Both	35 % in Physical Science
Geography	35 % in Geography
Computer Application	35 % in Mathematics

4) For regulation 5 substitute the following regulation:

5. Subjects of Study at Madhyamik level-

5 (2) The Council has designed the Madhyamik Level course as per new curriculum as detailed in Table-1.

5) For regulation 6 substitute the following regulation:

6. Subjects of Study at Uchcha Madhyamik level-

6 (2) The Council has designed the Uchcha Madhyamik Level course as per new curriculum as detailed in Table-2.

6) For regulation 11 substitute the following regulation:

11. Procedure for enrollment and registration of student of Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) -

11(2) A student shall be eligible to appear in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) with not more than three subjects (one paper carrying 100 marks) one year after his/her registration and he/she shall be eligible to appear in all subjects at a time or in residuary subjects two years after his / her registration with the concerned subjects.

7) For regulation 13 substitute the following regulation:-

“Handicapped” word will be replaced as “Persons with Disabilities” in section 13 (1) & 13 (2)

8) to sub-regulation (3) of regulation 13, add the following proviso:

13. Exemption from payment of fees-

13(3) All admission & examination fees will be exempted for the student of Govt Correctional Home / Juvenile Home/Child Home/ Other Govt. Approved Home in Madhyamik (Secondary) level and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level.

9) For regulation 16 substitute the following regulation:

16. Procedure for credit transfer at Madhyamik (Secondary) Level-

16 (2) (a) A student who appeared at Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) from any Govt. recognized Board / Council / Open School or The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling may be permitted for a maximum of four subjects for credit transfer, in which a student obtained passed/qualified marks should be declared at least 25 or above out of 100 in each subject, provided the subject are offered by The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling and conversion of marks for credit transfer will made as per process of **TABLE-C**.

10) to sub-regulation (8), (9) of regulation 16, add the following proviso:

16. Procedure for credit transfer at Madhyamik (Secondary) Level-

16(8) The student has to be appeared in failed /disqualified subject/subjects both in Written and Project/Internal Formative Evaluation, but the student could not appear in the credited subject/subjects. The result will be finalised according to this regulation for the students who has already been registered their name in Madhyamik (Secondary) level.

16(9) The facility of credit transfer shall not be allowed after a period of five years from the year of last examination in which a student appeared in Madhyamik (Secondary) level from The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or any Govt. recognized Board/ Council / Open School. Original unsuccessful Mark Sheet will be submitted to the Council with the other documents at the time of credit transfer admission. This facility shall not be allowed after a period of five years from the year of last examination in which a student appeared in Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) level from Govt. recognized Board / Council / Open School and The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling.

11) For regulation 17 substitute the following regulation:

17. Procedure for credit transfer at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level-

17 (2) (a) A student who appeared at Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) from any Govt. recognized Board / Council / Open School or The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling may be permitted for a maximum of three subjects for credit transfer, in which a student obtained pass/qualifying marks in each subject, provided the subject are offered by The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling and conversion of marks for credit transfer will made as per process of **TABLE-D**.

12) to sub-regulation (8) of regulation 17, add the following proviso:

17. Procedure for credit transfer at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level-

17(8) The facility of credit transfer shall not be allowed after a period of five years from the year of last examination in which a student appeared in Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level from The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling / Govt. recognized Board / Council / Open School.

17(9) A credit transfer student shall be eligible to appear in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) with all examination subject(s) after one year of his / her registration. Original unsuccessful Mark Sheet will be submitted to the Council with the other documents at the time of credit transfer admission. This facility shall not be allowed after a period of five years from the year of last examination in which a student appeared in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) level from Govt. recognized Board / Council / Open School and The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling.

13) to sub-regulation (6) of regulation 25, add the following proviso:

25. Disciplinary Board-

25(6) According to the decision of the Council along with Disciplinary Board regarding the guilty of committing any misconduct or malpractice or breach of discipline, the result of the student will be finalized & mark sheet will be issued accordingly.

14) For regulation 28 substitute the following regulation:

28. Hour of examination-

28 (1) (a) Total duration of written examination 3 hours 15 minutes each subject. In a written examination, extra 15 minutes time will be allowed to the candidates for reading purpose per subject in the Madhyamik Prakisha (Secondary Examination).

28 (1) (b) Total duration of written examination 3 hours 15 minutes for each subject. The time is allotted both for reading question paper and writing answer in the Uchcha Madhyamik Prakisha (Higher Secondary Examination).

28(2) (a) Subject wise Internal Formative Evaluation / Project Examination will be done by the respective study centre in the stipulated specific time period, which will be notified by the respective study centre as per instruction of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, where the learners registered their names in Madhyamik (Secondary) Level.

28(2) (b) Project Examination & Practical Examination will be done by the respective study centre in the stipulated specific time period, which will be notified by the respective study centre as per instruction of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, where the learners registered their names in Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.

15) to sub-regulation (4) of regulation 30, add the following proviso:

30. General structure of Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and condition relating to declaring a student pass-

30(4) If the additional subject(s) in which student's registration / enrolment is nil in all study centres for at least 3 years consecutively, then such additional subject(s) may be withdrawn from the curriculum with immediate effect.

The marks obtained by him/her in additional subject, in excess of 25% shall not be added in Grand Total marks for determining his/her Grade.

30 (5) Omitting the Sub Regulation From THE REGULATION of "*Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya (Admission and Examination) Regulations, 2006*".

16) For regulation 30 substitute the following regulation:

30. General structure of Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and condition relating to declaring a student pass-

30 (6) (i) Internal Formative Evaluation / Project will be introduced from Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination). For qualifying in an Examination Subject, a candidate must have appeared in both Written and Internal Formative Evaluation/Project and the candidate has to score at least 25 marks or above out of 100 i.e. pass marks in each subject is 25 out of 100 combining Written examination (Full Marks. 90) and Internal Formative Evaluation/Project examination (Full Marks 10).

(ii) If a candidate is absent in any Internal Formative Evaluation/Project or Written (Theoretical) examinations or both (Internal Formative Evaluation/Project and Written / Theoretical) examination in a subject/subjects then he/she will not be able to qualify/pass in the respective subject/subjects.

(iii) If a candidate appeared in both (Internal Formative Evaluation/Project and Written / Theoretical) examination but could not pass or qualify in a subject/subjects then his/her marks of Internal Formative Evaluation / Project will be carried over in next future examinations and he/she will be allowed to reappear Written (Theoretical) examination only in that/those subject/subjects if his/her chance(s) of appearance for the said examination is/are available. But he/she will not be allowed for Internal Formative Evaluation/Project examinations in that subject/subjects in next future examinations.

(iv) If a candidate appeared in only Written (Theoretical) examinations in a subject/subjects but could not appear in Internal Formative Evaluation/Project in that respective subject/subjects, then his/her marks of Written (Theoretical)examination will not be carried over in next future examination, and he/she should be allowed to appear in that subject/subjects in the next future examination if he/she will appear in both (Written /Theoretical and Internal Formative Evaluation/Project) examination in that subject/subjects, whether his/her chance(s) of appearance for the said examination is(are) available.

30 (7) (i) Grade system will be introduced for each Examination subject and will be introduced for Grand Total (for passed candidate) from Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination). Overall Grade will be calculated on Grand Total divided by 7 (number of compulsory Subjects), without rounding off. In this context the TABLE-A is showing for overall Grade and subject Grade system in Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) level.

(ii) The following Abbreviations will be introduced in the Marksheet of the Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination).

P for Successful Candidate

X for Unsuccessful Candidate

Q for Qualified

DQ for Disqualified

CAN for Cancelled

NA for Not Applicable

CT for Credit Transfer

(iii) Grade system will be introduced in the certificate at Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination).

(iv) If subject experts declare a/many question/s, paper/papers difficult, then Grace Marks of 2 may be administered at Madhyamik (Secondary) level. Giving Grace Marks should not be a binding policy.

(v) Full credit will be given (if attempted) for wrong Question/s in any subject/s with the approval of the subject experts at Madhyamik (Secondary) level.

(vi) If any written answer script(s) is/are lost or damaged due to unavoidable circumstances in any subject(s) of a candidate, then the highest marks obtained by him/her in other subjects in the said examination, will be provided to the lost/damage subject(s) of that candidate.

17) to sub-regulation (8) of regulation 30, add the following proviso:

30. General structure of Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and condition relating to declaring a candidate pass-

30 (8) If any candidate will go to the examination venue / centre after one hour from commencement of Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) the candidate will not be allowed for appearing that day's examination.

18) For regulation 31 substitute the following regulation:

31. General structure of Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) and condition relating to declaring a candidate pass

31 (3) Omitting the Sub Regulation From THE REGULATION of "*Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya (Admission and Examination) Regulations, 2006*".

31(4) (i) In order to be declared successful in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) a candidate must obtain 30% marks in each of the two languages and in each of at least three elective subjects. In each subject, marks of Theory (Paper) full marks 80(eighty), where pass marks Theory (Paper) 24 (twenty four) and full marks of Practical/Project paper 20 (twenty) where pass marks Practical/Project (Paper) 06 (Six). If a candidate becomes successful in a subject, he/she shall have to passed in Theoretical and Project/Practical papers separately (i.e 24 marks for theory & 06 marks for Project / Practical in each subject).

(ii) Pass marks obtained in practical / project, should be carried over to the following examination, till validity of his / her registration.

(iii) If a candidate becomes successful in the examination with four elective subjects the marks scored by him/her in that elective subject where the score is minimum shall be treated as optional elective subject. The Grand Total marks will be calculated as follows – the highest marks obtained in five subjects including language Group and Optional Elective Subject, if any, where a minimum pass marks in each language of Language Group should be secured mandatorily and accordingly ,mark sheet is printed. Overall Grade is calculated by dividing the Grand Total by five.

(iv) Failure in obtaining the minimum pass marks in a compulsory elective subject, but has obtained the minimum pass marks in the optional elective subject, shall be declared passed by giving him/her the benefit of interchanging the compulsory elective subject as the optional elective subject and vice versa.

31 (5) The marks obtained by the candidate in Optional Elective shall not be added in Grand Total marks for determining his/her Grade in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination).

31 (7) (i) "Grade" System will be introduced in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination). Grade system will be applicable for each Examination subject and will be applicable for Grand Total (for passed candidate) in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) Overall Grade will be calculated on Grand Total. It is done by taking into account the highest marks obtained in five subjects including Language Group and optional Elective Subject if any, where a minimum pass marks in each language of language Group should be secured mandatorily and accordingly, mark sheet is printed .Overall grade is calculated by Grand Total by five without rounding off. The following Abbreviations will be introduced in the Marksheet of the Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination). In this context the TABLE-B is showing for overall Grade and subject Grade system in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) level.

(ii) Grade system will be introduced in the certificate at Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination).

(iii) Introduction of "Grace Marks" - If subject experts declare a many question/s, paper/papers difficult, then Grace Marks of 2 may be administered at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level. Giving Grace Marks should not be a binding policy.

(iv) Full credit will be given (if attempt) for wrong Question/s in any subject/s with the approval of the subject experts at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level.

(v) If any written answer script/s is/are lost or damaged in any unavoidable circumstances in any subject/s of a candidate, then highest marks of his/her other subjects which he/she has been secured in the said examination, that highest marks will be provided to the lost/damage subject(s) at Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level

19) to sub-regulation (8) of regulation 31, add the following proviso:

31. General structure of Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) and condition relating to declaring a candidate pass-

31 (8) If any candidate will go to the examination venue / centre after one hour in Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) the candidate will not be allowed for appearing that day's examination. The candidate must enter in the Examination hall within one hour.

20) For regulation 32 substitute the following regulation:

32. Bar to use electronic device

32 (1) If any candidate takes any Calculator, Mobile phone, Pager, Smart Watch or electronic gadgets/devices in the Examination Hall at Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination) his/her full examination will be treated as cancelled on that day(s).

32 (3) Pencil / Red ink should not be used for answering questions. However Pencil may be used for sketching drawing and labelling etc.

21) to sub-regulation (9) of regulation 33, add the following proviso:

33. Provision for post publication scrutiny and Post Publication Review/ Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) –

33(9) (i) (a) An unsuccessful candidate may apply for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) in unsuccessful subject(s) within 15 days from the date of publication of result through the Co-ordinator for one or more answer script(s)/paper(s) of the particular examination on payment of a fee prescribed by the Council expressly stating that the same is being paid for the purpose of Re-examination/ Post Publication Review/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR). The President of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling may extend the date of submission of application for Post Publication Review/Re-examination/ Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR), if necessary in Madhyamik (Secondary) level.

(b) A candidate may apply for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) in subject(s) within 15 days from the date of publication of result through the Co-ordinator for one or more answer script(s)/paper(s) of the particular examination on payment of a fee prescribed by the Council expressly stating that the same is being paid for the purpose of Re-examination/Post Publication Review/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR). The President of The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling may extend the date of submission of application for Post Publication Review/Re-examination/ Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR), if necessary in Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level.

(ii) A candidate may apply Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) and Post Publication Review /Re-examination/ Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) for offline / online through the Co-ordinator of the study centre/ institution at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level. He/She shall submit his/her prayer for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/ /Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) as the case may be to the Co-ordinator of the institution/study centre on plain paper stating clearly (i) Name of the Candidate

- (ii) Registration No. & Roll No. and (iii) Name of the subject(s) for which Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) or Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) is sought for along with self attested photo copy of Marksheet and the prescribed fees. Offline/Online format is available in the official website of the Council.
- (iii) A candidate may apply only for Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) or Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) for any particular subject. A candidate cannot apply both for Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) and Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) in a particular subject at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (iv) An incomplete or erroneous application for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall be summarily rejected and the rejection shall be communicated to the candidate through respective Study Centre and no correspondence shall be entertained in that behalf at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (v) Application for Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) or Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall be restricted to theoretical paper(s)/script(s) only at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level. Applicant may seek review / scrutiny in all subjects, in which he/she actually appeared in written examination at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (vi) It shall be obligatory on the part of a candidate applying for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) to accept the alterations in marks, if any, after Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (vii) The Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall be carried out by such person as may be specified by the Council at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (viii) Application for Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall not ensure result of such scrutiny before the date fixed for submitting application for next examination, and unsuccessful candidates shall, in their own interest, submit application form for enrollment for the next examination within the date/dates specified at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (ix) Results of Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) or Post Publication Review / Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall be communicated to the concerned Study Centre(s) /Institution(s) by the Council. Candidate/ Study Centre may also know the result of Post Publication Review / Re-examination/ /Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) from Council's Official Website at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.
- (x) A candidate shall have to accept the results of Post Publication Review / Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR). The result of the Post Publication Review /Re-examination/Post Publication Re-evaluation (PPR) shall be final and binding on the candidate at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level. If a candidate failed / disqualified in a subject after Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS) / Publication Re-evaluation (PPR), original result(s) will be retained.

22) For regulation 34 substitute the following regulation:

34. Migration Certificate, Verification -

- 34 (1) (a) Migration Certificate will be given to all passed candidate along with his/her Marksheets & Certificates at the time of declaration of result along with Mark sheets & Certificates of Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination). The Migration fees will be given by all candidates with his/her examination fees. This fee may be determined by the Council.
- (b) After issuance of migration certificate any correction will not be done by the Council at Madhyamik (Secondary) and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.

34 (3) The Council shall verify all the documents such as Registration Certificate, Admit Card, Marksheet & Pass Certificate issued by this Council of any candidate, on application/query from the different Employers (Government / Non Government), in case of Non Government Organizations on payment of such fee, may be determined by the Council at Madhyamik (Secondary) Level and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.

23) For regulation 37 substitute the following regulation:

37. Correction of documents-

37 (3) Correction in the admission records will be considered prior to appearing in the first examination at Madhyamik (Secondary) Level and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level. No request for correction will be accepted after one year (first examination) from the date of registration at Madhyamik (Secondary) Level and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) Level.

24) to regulation 38, add the following proviso:

38. Preservation of records-

38 (1) All authentic & substantive evidential documents regarding admission / registration/ enrolment / result data of a candidate in Madhyamik (Secondary) level and Uchcha Madhyamik (Higher Secondary) level at our admitted study centre under The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling should be kept / preserved by the respective Study Centre.

25) to regulation 41, add the following proviso:

The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling has the following provision for Physically disable / Mentally disable / Children With Special Needs (CWSN) students during Madhyamik Pariksha (Secondary Examination) and Uchcha Madhyamik Pariksha (Higher Secondary Examination)

- (a) Allow extra time for completion of exams.
- (b) Make arrangements for different rooms, chairs, Table / Bench etc for certain categories of disability (physical impairment, spastic students)
- (c) Allow the usage of magnifying glass for Visually impaired candidates.
- (d) Verbal instruction for examination to be written on black board of exam room.
- (e) Clarification of examination directions, Colour naming (for students with colour blindness).
- (f) Provision of access of sign language interpreters.
- (g) Provision of Reader to read the question paper in case student with disability does not want scribe facility and mentioning the guidelines for the same (limiting the role of the reader only for reading the paper, qualifications of the reader.)
- (h) Allow the usage of sketch pens for writings exams for Visually Impaired candidates.
- (i) Allow the usage of calculator (or talking calculator for Visually Impaired candidates)
- (j) Assistive devices permitted during the exam for disabled students
- (k) Provision of a scribe to write the answer / interpreter.
- (l) Permission for the candidates to take the examination in a hospital under supervision.
- (m) Permission for the presence of the caregiver inside the examination room during the exam?
- (n) Send the answer book of candidates with disabilities separately to the concerned office.
